- Opened meeting 8:36
- Agenda Approval – Amended 2 items. Motion by Nick, Second AJ – Approved unanimously
- Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes – Motion by Chris, Second Nick – Approved unanimously
- Treasurer's Report (Nathan)
 - No report on current balance
 - Spoke with Ethics board, explained we were contacted about missing an ethics report (different standards for Major Party vs. PAC).
 - Recap on Account Status:
 - There have been complaints that LPIA is not current on account filing, due to missing a July filing that would have been required if LPIA was listed as PAC. However, account is still Major Party, for which next filling would be January.
 - Nathan reached out regarding change in status. Ethics board response stated there has been turnover, they should have reached out to make sure change from Major Party to PAC happened, and didn't. They state LP can do the January filing, per the account we have, LPIA is not considered behind, can just file in January, will give us a new account for PAC status.
 - Also, there is a balance outstanding since 2017 due to issues from now-deceased individual and we are reporting \$18xx less than we have. Rules are that if you can't prove where you got the money from, you have to write a check and return it to the State. In changing account from Major Party to PAC, Nathan said there is an email saying Board approved this, it will be possible to get this cleaned up finally.
- Potential Candidate – Clayton Budde
 - Factory worker in Miles, Iowa, works in Preston. Hoping to run for State office in Iowa's 1st Congressional District. Government spending, gun regulation and border control are his 3 big issues; doesn't believe government should regulate health care, abortion, etc. Federal government should be protecting citizens.
 - Jules recommended next step is collecting signatures – also will need to think about getting social media and paper literature, and connecting with Nick Gluba and Thomas Laehn, who are already collecting signatures
 - John offered to reach out to have more conversation; Jacob will send invite to Discord; Jules

- shared her cell number if he has any additional questions
- Convention
 - Several weekends in February, March or April are under consideration
 - Tai is helping coordinating location
 - Place/cost
 - Holiday Inn is no longer an option; Grandview has been used, but its going to be fairly expensive
 - New Hilton is opening Wednesday. Tai knows owners and developers, but will need body count to know how much space required. \$500 per day – will discount block of rooms, have a pool, etc. Will permit having outside caterers; also have a bar and restaurant
 - Polk County Christmas party was held at newer member’s real estate agency location in Ankeny that has a large meeting room – would not have enough space for banquet style event, no hotel, but would be good pricing. We could have separate event Friday night for social hour
 - Tai will get more details on the Hilton venue and send it out for email
 - Conclusion – will wait on email detail from Tai and Jules, then lets have an email vote on date and location this week (week of December 7)
- Bylaws/Constitution committee
 - Someone has a list of things that need to be addressed – for example, mechanism for missing people that need to be removed from positions.
 - Jules will reach out to Thomas Laehn and Monica, they will look into this
- Audit
 - Jacob will find people to do audit before convention
- Fundraising
 - Jules will get letter out for review
- Moellman invoice – payment and auto-payment
 - For now, Nathan will just need to send paper checks, Jules recommended sending a quarterly amount to avoid late feeds, and request him to set up auto-payment
- Signature collection
 - Nick has attempted, but snow has interfered with efforts; is coordinating town hall type events with Thomas Laehn, but he is out of country for a couple weeks
 - Polk County has a contact name Tommy who has collected two full sheets each for Nick and Thomas
 - Tai is working on a website for Nick’s campaign, needs to include a donations page
- Brownstone – COVID-19 Response
 - Jacob brought this up, it’s supporting a Resolution for the US Senate to pass something to prevent anything like the Covid-19 response from happening again in the future– several other states and organizations have signed onto it, he will send an email out so everyone can read it
